【 I 】 次は、高校生の Ami、Koji、Rika、アメリカからの留学生である Liam の会話文である。それを読み、あとの間に答えなさい。

Koji: Hey guys! A surprising thing happened at the supermarket.

Rika: What happened?

Koji: Liam talked to a clerk. He said, “Hello. It’s getting colder, isn’t it?”

Liam: It was just a short conversation. I think a little conversation makes our lives better.

Koji: I usually don’t talk to people I don’t know very well.

Rika: I know that. But I sometimes do.

Koji: Do you?

Rika: Yes. Three days ago, when I got on an elevator at a station, I talked to an old woman who had a big bag.

Ami: What did you say to her?

Rika: I said to her, “Shall I carry your bag? ” She smiled and answered, “Oh, thank you.” I took her bag. Then we got off the elevator and went to a bus stop in front of the station together.

Liam: That was nice of you.

Rika: I just helped the old woman because she needed help. I enjoyed talking with her.

Ami: I enjoy a little conversation, too.

Koji: Really?

Ami: Yes. Last Saturday, I went to a restaurant with my mother and I had a conversation with a little boy there.

Koji: A boy?

Ami: Yes. The restaurant was very crowded. We had to wait to get a table. The boy was waiting in front of me with his father. The boy looked tired and cried, “I’m hungry. I can’t wait anymore.”

Koji: How old was he?

Ami: He looked about five or six.

Liam: It’s hard for a little child to wait for a long time.

Ami: His father told him to stop crying, but he didn’t. I said to the boy, “Hi, I’m hungry, too. What do you want to eat?”

Liam: Did he say anything back to you?

Ami: Yes. We enjoyed talking about food for a while. After that, his father said to me, “Thank you for talking with my son.” I was happy to hear that.

Koji: That was nice.

Rika: You were very helpful to the boy and his father.

Ami: Yes. I think the interaction at the restaurant was a good opportunity for me to think about relationships with others.

Liam: That’s right!

Koji: A little conversation helps to start new relationships. Alright, maybe I’ll try it too.

【Ⅱ】 次の英文は「学校で授業中にタブレット PC を使うこと」についての 2 人の意見である。これを読んであとの間に答えなさい。

Kana's opinion:

I think it is a good idea for students to use tablet PCs during classes. First, studying with a tablet PC is more realistic than with a paper-based textbook. When students learn about living things such as animals, they can see them moving in detail in the video.

Second, since today's students were born in the digital age, they are accustomed to using this type of technology. With tablet PCs, they can easily create new things, such as music and videos.

Therefore, it is a good idea for students to use tablet PCs during classes.

Hide's opinion:

I do not think it is a good idea for students to use tablet PCs for learning at school.

First, students have less opportunities to write when using tablet PCs. When they type, tablet PCs can convert kanji instantly, so they can't remember how to write kanji.

Second, students have little experience in the real world because they can see pictures and watch videos on tablet PCs. Students should play and learn in the real world.

Therefore, it is not a good idea for students to use tablet PCs during classes.

Nina: Why don't we start an exercise program to help us prepare?

Bella: That's a great idea, Nina, but what do you recommend? Should we focus on muscle strength or stamina?

Nina: Well, I think the most important thing is to improve our stamina. We'll be skiing on some of the most challenging mountains in Aomori. If we're not well-conditioned, we'll run out of energy quickly. What do you think, Jason?

Jason: Exactly. I think we should start jogging...maybe five kilometers a day, and gradually work our way up to ten. What do you think, Bella?

Bella: I agree, but I think we should also focus a little on strength. If our legs aren't strong enough, we won't be able to make sharp turns or stop quickly. If we get injured, our trip will be over! If we only focus on stamina, we won't have enough muscle.

Jason: I guess so. Do you have any suggestions for building up strength?

Nina: Well, in addition to the jogging, maybe every other day we could do weight training. I recommend squats. That'll really make our legs stronger.

Jason: Bella, are you OK with Nina's idea?

Bella: I think every other day is too much. We have only six months before our trip, and I think stamina has to be our priority.

Jason: OK. Let's go running on Mondays and Fridays, and then go to the weight room on Wednesdays. This would give us the best mix of stamina and strength.
